#### A Word from the Pastor

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect."

#### -Romans 12:2 (NRSV)

Since we are not having worship the first Sunday of this month (due to Salmon Days), I decided to use a shortened form of the sermon I would have preached on that Sunday, for my Bell article this month. So this is the third in my series of five challenges I want to leave this church. This challenge is presented by what Paul says in Romans 12:2, which is, in essence, Don't be a conformist church, becoming whatever the society around you wants you to be. There are churches which seem to be trying to do just that. Surveys show people are "made uncomfortable" by the Cross and talk of Christ's death on that Cross. And so some churches, in order to conform to what "seekers" are looking for, take the Cross out of their worship area. Some "church growth" experts say that if you want to attract new people, don't say anything that might be controversial, and avoid saying anything which might make people feel guilty. Let me first say that, as I think you know from our 4 ½ years together, I do not try to make people feel bad about themselves, or say a lot of things that are divisive to the church fellowship. However, sometimes you need to challenge people to take "a step higher" than they are. Sometimes you have to take a stand – a stand which will have some disagreeing with you. You keep on loving each other and you keep on affirming the value of the fellowship. But you still take a stand.

A Christian church should not be about forming itself into whatever it seems people want. Companies that serve the public might want to do that. When they make a hamburger for you, they want to "do it YOUR way." But a church exists for a different purpose. We are seeking to find the "will of God" - not the result of the latest marketing poll! "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern the will of God..." That doesn't mean you totally disregard the tastes and opinions of the people in your community. The kind of music they like, the décor which might attract them, the activities we might want to sponsor as a fellowship – all these can be adapted to the people we want to attract. Of course, the church must do this, tempered by a certain amount of humility. It is all too easy for a church or church leader to take the attitude, "I know what God's will is, and you just need to fall in line with what I tell you!" People find spiritual renewal not by being told the truth by the "enlightened", but rather by

having someone walk alongside them as they search. Churches are not for people who have "arrived", but for people who are on a journey seeking God. But that, the will of God, is the destination. Life is not about what "the people" want; it's about what God wants.

So my challenge to this church as you move into the future, is to seek transformation over conformity.


