A Word from the Pastor

"Do not remember the former things, Or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; Now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?"

-Isaiah 43:18-19 (NRSV)

People sometimes think that those who are part of a congregation of older people, only do "old, traditional" things — what they have always done before. But starting at or near the end of the month of September, we will be BREAKING THAT STEREOTYPE! God is about to do A NEW THING through us.

The old stereotype says that old people worship in old buildings, but God's "new thing" in us, is that we will be moving into a newly remodeled building, built to suit our fellowship.

The old stereotype says that people worship in fixed pews, with a long narrow sanctuary where the people feel distant from each other, but our new sanctuary will bring us close together.

The old stereotype says that only a new start -up church of younger people worship in a storefront church, but we, the longest-established church in Issaquah, are doing a NEW THING, and our new facility is right in the heart of one of our city's busiest commercial districts – Gilman Boulevard.

The old stereotype says that when a church

declines in numbers and becomes made up of mostly older members, it is just getting ready to quietly fade away; but this church is doing a NEW THING – we are being reborn to a new mission, a mission of giving to people in need, and a mission of reaching out in Christ's name to the retired and semi-retired people of our community.

So, what do YOU want to be part of? – an old stereotype of what older people are supposed to do and be like; or God's NEW THING he is doing in our community?

The Scripture passage from Isaiah was written at a time of transition of the people of Israel. They were going through hard times as a nation, and they kept recalling "the good old days", the days when God led them out of Egypt. But God was telling the people through Isaiah that what he was about to do for the people was so great that they should not even think about those "things of old". The new thing was that he was about to lead them out of captivity to Babylon, and to lead them to a time of national revival back in their home country.

For us, God's NEW THING is that he is leading us to be reborn as a church. We have "things of old" we like to think about as well – how everything was in the 80's and 90's back in the old building. We certainly want to be thankful for those experiences. But what God wants us to
